Verses Saying Repent in the New Testament (NKJV)

Repentance is inseparable from faith in Jesus, the FIRST thing taught by John the Baptist, Jesus, and His apostles. Repent is Greek metanoia (Strong's G3340), which means to change your mind. If someone has not decided to cease his/her adultery, lying, unrighteousness, etc., he/she will end up in the lake that burns with fire, the second death. (Revelation 21:8, 1 Corinthians 6:9-10, etc.)

54 scriptures

Matthew 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 2 and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" 3 For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah, saying:

"The voice of one crying in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord;

Make His paths straight."

4 Now John himself was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist; and his food was locusts and wild honey. 5 Then Jerusalem, all Judea, and all the region around the Jordan went out to him 6 and were baptized by him in the Jordan, confessing their sins.

7 But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "Brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance, 9 and do not think to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I say to you that God is able to raise up children to Abraham from these stones. 10 And even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees. Therefore every tree which does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. 11 I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 12 His winnowing fan is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather His wheat into the barn; but He will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

Matthew 4:17

From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Matthew 9:13

But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy and not sacrifice.' For I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to <u>repentance</u>."

Matthew 11:20-21

Then He began to rebuke the cities in which most of His mighty works had been done, because they did not <u>repent</u>: "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works which were done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have <u>repented</u> long ago in sackcloth and ashes.

Matthew 12:41

The men of Nineveh will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because they <u>repented</u> at the preaching of Jonah; and indeed a greater than Jonah is here.

Mark 1:4

John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a <u>baptism of repentance</u> for the <u>remission</u> of sins.

Mark 1:14-15

Now after John was put in prison, Jesus came to Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Mark 2:17

When Jesus heard it, He said to them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance."

Mark 6:12

So they went out and preached that people should repent.

Luke 3:3

And he went into all the region around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of <u>repentance for the</u> remission of sins,

Luke 3:7-17

Then he said to the multitudes that came out to be baptized by him, "Brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance, and do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I say to you that God is able to raise up children to Abraham from these stones. 9 And even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees. Therefore every tree which does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." 10 So the people asked him, saying, "What shall we do then?" 11 He answered and said to them, "He who has two tunics, let him give to him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise." 12 Then tax collectors also came to be baptized, and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?" 13 And he said to them, "Collect no more than what is appointed for you." 14 Likewise the soldiers asked him, saying, "And what shall we do?" So he said to them, "Do not intimidate anyone or accuse falsely, and be content with your wages." 15 Now as the people were in expectation, and all reasoned in their hearts about John, whether he was the Christ or not, 16 John answered, saying to all, "I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 17 His winnowing fan is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather the wheat into His barn; but the chaff He will burn with unquenchable fire."

Luke 5:32

I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance."

Luke 10:13

"Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works which were done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have <u>repented</u> long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes.

Luke 11:32

The men of Nineveh will rise up in the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and indeed a greater than Jonah is here.

Luke 13:1

There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. 2 And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans, because they suffered such things? 3 I tell you, no; but <u>unless you repent you will all likewise perish</u>. 4 Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem? 5 I tell you, no; but <u>unless you repent you will all likewise perish</u>."

Luke 15:7

I say to you that likewise there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine just persons who need no repentance.

Luke 15:10

Likewise, I say to you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Luke 16:30

And he said, 'No, father Abraham; but if one goes to them from the dead, they will repent.'

Luke 17:3

Take heed to yourselves. If your brother sins against you, rebuke him; and if he <u>repents</u>, forgive him.

Luke 17:4

And if he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times in a day returns to you, saying, 'I repent,' you shall forgive him."

Luke 24:47

and that <u>repentance and remission of sins</u> should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.

Acts 2:38

Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 3:19

Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord,

Acts 5:31

Him God has exalted to His right hand to be Prince and Savior, to give <u>repentance</u> to Israel and forgiveness of sins.

Acts 8:22

Repent therefore of this your wickedness, and pray God if perhaps the thought of your heart may be forgiven you.

Acts 11:18

When they heard these things they became silent; and they glorified God, saying, "Then God has also granted to the Gentiles <u>repentance to life</u>."

Acts 13:24

after John had first preached, before His coming, the <u>baptism of repentance</u> to all the people of Israel.

Acts 17:30

Truly, these times of ignorance God overlooked, but now commands all men everywhere to repent,

Acts 19:4

Then Paul said, "John indeed baptized with a <u>baptism of repentance</u>, saying to the people that they should believe on Him who would come after him, that is, on Christ Jesus." 5 When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.

Acts 20:21

testifying to Jews, and also to Greeks, <u>repentance</u> toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ.

Acts 26:20

but declared first to those in Damascus and in Jerusalem, and throughout all the region of Judea, and then to the Gentiles, that they should repent, turn to God, and <u>do works befitting repentance</u>.

Romans 2:4

Or do you despise the riches of His goodness, forbearance, and longsuffering, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?

2 Corinthians 7:9

Now I rejoice, not that you were made sorry, but that your sorrow led to <u>repentance</u>. For you were made sorry in a godly manner, that you might suffer loss from us in nothing.

2 Corinthians 7:10

For godly sorrow produces <u>repentance leading to salvation</u>, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death.

2 Corinthians 12:21

lest, when I come again, my God will humble me among you, and I shall mourn for many who have sinned before and have not <u>repented</u> of the uncleanness, fornication, and lewdness which they have practiced.

2 Timothy 2:25

in humility correcting those who are in opposition, if God perhaps will grant them <u>repentance</u>, so that they may know the truth,

Hebrews 6:1

Therefore, leaving the discussion of the elementary principles of Christ, let us go on to perfection, not laying again the foundation of <u>repentance</u> from dead works and of faith toward God.

Hebrews 6:6

if they fall away, to renew them again to <u>repentance</u>, since they crucify again for themselves the Son of God, and put Him to an open shame.

Hebrews 12:17

For you know that afterward, when he wanted to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no place for <u>repentance</u>, though he sought it diligently with tears.

2 Peter 3:9

The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to <u>repentance</u>.

Revelation 2:5

Remember therefore from where you have fallen; <u>repent</u> and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place—unless you repent.

Revelation 2:16

Repent, or else I will come to you quickly and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth.

Revelation 2:21

And I gave her time to repent of her sexual immorality, and she did not repent.

Revelation 2:22

Indeed I will cast her into a sickbed, and those who commit adultery with her into great tribulation, unless they repent of their deeds.

Revelation 3:3

Remember therefore how you have received and heard; hold fast and <u>repent</u>. Therefore if you will not watch, I will come upon you as a thief, and you will not know what hour I will come upon you.

Revelation 3:19

As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten. Therefore be zealous and repent.

Revelation 9:20

But the rest of mankind, who were not killed by these plagues, did not <u>repent</u> of the works of their hands, that they should not worship demons, and idols of gold, silver, brass, stone, and wood, which can neither see nor hear nor walk.

Revelation 9:21

And they did not <u>repent</u> of their murders or their sorceries or their sexual immorality or their thefts.

Revelation 16:9

And men were scorched with great heat, and they blasphemed the name of God who has power over these plagues; and they did not <u>repent</u> and give Him glory.

Revelation 16:11

They blasphemed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores, and did not <u>repent</u> of their deeds.
